SECURITY ISN'T GOING AWAY; **DON'T WORRY, BE CLOUDY**

It's about security. It's about making the right decisions. And most importantly, it's about protecting your enterprise, data, and personnel.

Mobile Cloud Computing and Security were the digital transformation topics that 19 speakers and 30 attendees focused on, learning from each other and networking in exclusive, one-to-one settings with on-site solution providers at the two-day Exchange.

From the FBI to the healthcare industry, cloud migration is taking hold, and security issues in that space as well as mobility are a top concern for all IT executives, as was evidenced by the myriad of speakers.

Security in the public space requires a virtual army of weapons to keep data safe, according to Nick Savage, Acting Assistant Special Agent of Cybersecurity for the Federal Bureau of Investigations, who kicked off the event with his day one keynote speech. Using global data to support his case, Savage explained to the audience that building blocks must first be put in place to construct a program that will keep threats to a minimum. Not addressing security issues is only going to cost enterprises more in the long run, he said.

"Security isn't just an IT issue," Savage said. "This is a business issue. And if you don't know the business, how do you know what's important? Does the company's board know what's important, and what are they going to do to protect the things that are most important?"

With the speed in which mobile device use is scaling, not just in the U.S. but globally, the ability to combat constant threats is falling behind, he said.

Savage's presentation touched on many points, but the overarching theme was that being focused on security is no longer just an option, rather it's a necessity. Enterprises - small, large, public or private - must adapt before a

threat completely destroys the organization. Whatever it costs to secure the enterprise will pale in comparison to the damage that could be done by a breach of any size.

DON'T WORRY, BE CLOUDY

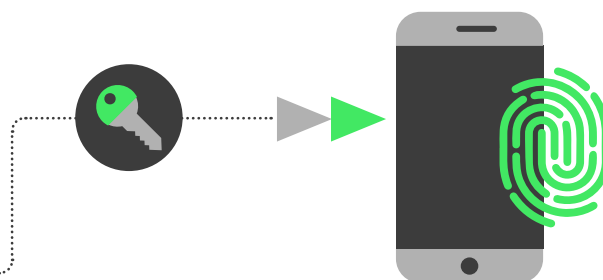
As data grows and the move from legacy systems to future trends evolves, it's imperative enterprises large and small store their information and do it securely. But managing that transformation is not easy, and the obstacles are plentiful.

Those pains and ultimate successes were explained by several of the event's speakers, including Jim Degliumberto, CIO of Southeastrans, Inc., who lead his enterprise into a hybrid cloud solution after navigating compliance and regulation issues as a member of the healthcare industry.

When considering the move to the cloud, whether hybrid or full approach, enterprises must "focus on what matters, what will work and what won't work, and should start small and expand," Degliumberto said. After the switch, businesses need to "stay current on the cloud, be alert of new products, and educate end users."

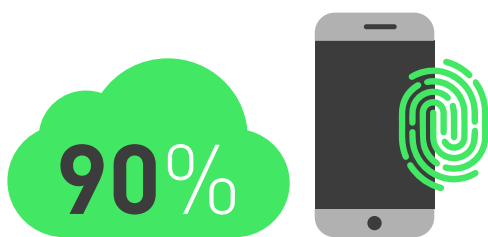
Ending the event with a look to the future, Bank of Mexico CISO Arturo Garcia-Hernandez tried to ease the fears of those hesitant to make the switch to a cloud solution.

Security in the cloud is an issue that won't be solved in the near future, Garcia-Hernandez said. But "Cloud computing is fundamental to encourage a needed revolution in Internet security," he continued. "Remember, don't worry, be cloudy."

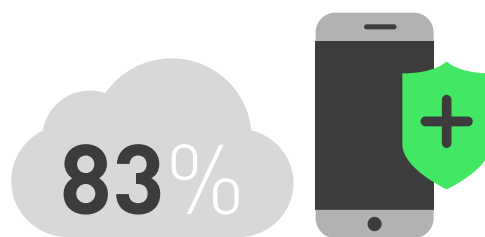
